Medium-HINDI

Each debate battle between two teams will last 16 minutes. One team will either affirm or oppose the motion.

Let us suppose there are two teams, TEAM A (members A1 and A2) and TEAM B (members B1 and B2).

OPENING PRESENTATION: 10 MINUTES

Each team is allowed 3 minutes to make their opening presentation. Presentations alternate between two teams, beginning with the first student arguing for the motion. The second team member is then allowed 2 minutes to challenge the opening presentations made by their opponents.

The speaking order will be as follows:

A1-presents their affirmative arguments (3 minutes)

B1- presents their opposition arguments (3 minutes)

A2-challenges the arguments made by their opponents/rebut (2 minutes)

B2-challenges the arguments made by their opponents/rebut (2 minutes)

QUESTIONS: 4 MINUTES

Teams will be allowed to pose one question each to their opponents. Teams have 2 minutes each to answer.

The speaking order will be as follows:

TEAM A-poses a question and TEAM B-answers the question (2 minutes)

TEAM B-poses a question and TEAM A-answers the question (2 minutes)

CONCLUSION: 2 MINUTES

Each team is then allowed up to 1 minute to sum up their arguments.

The time limit of the speeches will be strictly adhered to and the speakers will be stopped 10 seconds past the allotted time.
